Sauvignon Blanc

Hidden amongst the sprawling grapevines of 16th century France, Sauvignon Blanc grapes were named after the 'Sauvage', or 'wild' grapevines with similar leaf shapes. Outstanding examples from the Loire were characterized by aromatic depth, citrus-forward freshness, and crisp acidity.

Riesling

Rieslings are deeply rooted in Bavarian and Germanic origins, with writings of the grape dating back to 1435. Growers note that vines in the Americas and Australia grow thicker skins and branches (acclimatization to harsher climates), while those in Europe celebrate the ability to make a myriad of styles; from dry to lusciously sweet.

Nebbiolo

Early records of Nebbiolo and the Langhe tell of a sweet, sometimes sparkling wine that has since been lost to time. Wines made from Nebbiolo today stem from the 19th century, when French noblewoman (and later Marquise of Barolo), Giulia Falletti introduced red wines from her estate to the aristocratic circles of Torino. Upon tasting these bold reds, King Carlo Alberto of Savoy filled the streets of Turin with barrels of Barolos. Attention and investment from the royal family flooded the Langhe, some of whose castles still stand today.

Juyondai Sake

Founded in Edo period 1615 with over 400 years of history in the northern Yamagata Prefecture as the Takagi Shuzo brewery, Juyondai sakes are often rated as the most sought after sakes in the world.

The brewery is highly meticulous in its selection of rice for production; and its success largely associated with a fragrant, fruity aroma and fresh taste, in contrast to majority of spice-forward sakes enjoyed by the Japanese market.
